
Caulkins Conoco 50 years ago located in front of United Super Market, directly across from the current location on Main in Weatherford.





The talent show was sponsored by the Collegiate Activities Board—led by Chloe Turlington and Breanna Jones—and SWOSU Student Services.



SWOSU Digital Commons Downloads Surpass Quarter-Million Mark

As the SWOSU Digital Commons reaches its four-year anniversary, downloads for the entire collection have surpassed the quarter-million mark for the institutional repository at Southwestern Oklahoma State University with locations in Weatherford and Sayre.

The entire collection of 18,531 items have had a total of 250,779 downloads in 203 countries as of March 1, 2020. The collection opened on March 7, 2016.

Major collections in the repository include:

SWOSU journals and publications -- 4,096 items downloaded 93,125 times in 194 countries.

Faculty and student research, including entries in the SWOSU Research and Scholarly Activity Fair -- 326 works downloaded 18,108 times in more than 200 countries.

University history and productions -- 10,849 items downloaded 31,734 times in 129 countries. The university is in the midst of adding more collections to the digital repository representing the history and activities of SWOSU and of a few external organizations.

Lady Bulldogs Claim Third Consecutive National Tournament Berth


The reigning champions of the Central Region will have an opportunity to defend their crown after SWOSU claimed the No. 8 seed for the regional tournament, which will take place on March 13-16 in Warrensburg, Missouri.

This is the third consecutive year the Lady Bulldogs have been in the national tournament field and the fifth time in program history they've qualified for the NCAA postseason.

As the No. 8 seed, SWOSU earns a first-round date with regional host Central Missouri, who earned the right to host the tournament at the UCM Multipurpose Building, where they are 13-0 this season. The Jennies are 27-4 on the year, won the MIAA regular season and tournament championships and they enter the postseason on a ninegame winning streak. The Lady Bulldogs are 2-0 all-time against UCM in the Central Regional, claiming a 73-71 victory in 2013 before winning a memorable 75-72 victory in the regional semifinals last season.

SWOSU is joined in the field by fellow Great American Conference member Southeastern Oklahoma State, who defeated Arkansas-Monticello in the GAC Tournament final on Sunday to earn the league's automatic bid. As the No. 5-seed, Southeastern will face Emporia State in the quarterfinal round. The other side of the bracket includes Minnesota Duluth vs. Fort Hays State and Sioux Falls vs. St. Cloud State in the quarterfinals.

Head Coach Kelsi Musick has now guided the Lady Bulldogs to five NCAA Division II National Tournament appearances, with each coming since 2013. SWOSU is 6-4 all-time in the NCAA Tournament, which includes a run to the national championship game last season.



Aska, Tramble Highlight Lady Bulldogs Four All-GAC Selections

SWOSU senior guard Tyra Aska picked up her fourth consecutive All-Great American Conference selection and second straight First Team nod while Makyra Tramble was named the GAC Freshman of the Year and a Second Team selection on Wednesday night at an awards ceremony preceding the 2020 GAC Tournament.

The duo was joined on the team by Taber Beer and Bethany Franks, who both earned Honorable Mention, giving the Lady Bulldogs a league-leading four all-conference selections. SWOSU also had one GAC Distinguished Scholar Athlete in Dovile Štrimaityte.

Aska (Meridian, Okla.) becomes the fourth four-time All-GAC selection in conference history and the second from SWOSU, joining former teammate Hailey Tucker. This is the second straight year that Aska, a former GAC Defensive Player of the Year, earned a selection to the First Team and she does so as SWOSU's second-leading scorer at 11.4 points per game. She also ranks second on the team in assists and third in rebounds and steals. Earlier this season, Aska was named to the GAC's inaugural All-Decade Team

and she enters the GAC Tournament ranked fifth in school history in scoring with 1,551 career points and second in both career steals and assists.

Tramble (Shawnee, Okla.) burst onto the scene in her first collegiate season and becomes the first Lady Bulldog since Tucker (2016) to claim the GAC's Freshman of the Year award. She finished the regular season ranked second in the conference in scoring (15.8 ppg), fifth in rebounding (7.7 rpg) and sixth in steals (2.4 spg). Tramble has scored in double figures 25 times in 27 games this season, with eight 20-point games to her credit, and she's hit 62 three-pointers, the fourth-most of any player in the conference.

Beer (Hammon, Okla.) picks up her first career All-GAC selection following a junior season which has seen her rank fifth in the conference in assists (4.1 apg) and fourth in assist/turnover ratio (1.4/1). She also ranks fifth on the team in scoring at 10.0 points per game after scoring in double figures 17 times this season, with a season-high of 20 points at home against Henderson State.

Franks (Norman, Okla.) earns a spot on the All-GAC

This season, she ranks second in NCAA Division II with 102 steals (3.6 per game), which is three away from breaking the single-season record she set last season. Franks has recorded three double-doubles this season and she ranks as SWOSU's fourth-leading scorer (10.3 ppg) and second-leading rebounder (7.5 rpg).

Strimaityte (Palanga, Lithuania) earns her second consecutive Distinguished Scholar Athlete award after her senior season. She is set to graduate from SWOSU in July with a degree in Biological Sciences and then plans to pursue a Master's Degree in Biomedical Engineering at the University of North Texas beginning in August.

SWOSU has now received a league-leading 27 All-Great American Conference selections in the nine-year history of the conference, including 13 First Team All-GAC selections and 13 specialty awards. The Lady Bulldogs open up play in the 2020 GAC Tournament on Friday night at 8:00 pm, facing Arkansas-Monticello in the quarterfinals.

LOCAL AND AREA NEWS

CUSTER COUNTY-FATALITY- An accident, involving three motorcycles in Custer County, resulted in the death of one person and the hospitalization of two others. The Oklahoma Highway Patrol said 65-year-old Vonnie Long of Oklahoma City died at the scene of the accident on interstate 40 about 2 miles east of Clinton. Troopers said Long and two other motorcycles attempted to take the off ramp at exit 71 and failed to negotiate a curve. Sixty-seven-year-old Barton Long and 65-year-old Donna Wilson, both of Oklahoma City, were hospitalized as a result of the accident . All three motorcyclist were thrown during the mishap.

CENSUS-MILLER- Census information will come out in the mail to Custer County residents later this month. Custer county Commissioner Lyle Miller stresses that county residents need to be aware of the information that can affect area government agencies. Miller said he is concerned that people will throw away the census information and not participate.

BURNS FLAT- BOEING- State officials say Boeing still has plans to use the Clinton-Sherman airport at Burns Flat for flight test of the 737 max and 777x aircrafts, but it's unknown when the testing will begin. During a meeting of the Oklahoma Space Industry Development Authority last week, Director Bill Khourie confirmed that Boeing Commercial aircraft is interested in utilizing the facility for a definite time frame and is waiting for more information from Boeing. It is believed once testing begins, those tests could last for several months.

THOMAS-ROAD CLOSING-The Oklahoma Department of Transportation said State Highway 33 will be closed between County Road North 2370 and just west of State Highway 47 in Thomas from March 3rd through the summer. It's part of a bridge and pavement reconstruction project. Drivers should locate an alternate route or follow the signed detour of State Highway 47, U.S. 183 and State Highway 33. The \$7 million contract was awarded to Treas Construction of Coalgate. Work is projected to be completed this summer.

WEATHERFORD- POLICE DEPARTMENT FACEBOOK- The Weatherford Police Department has gone live with a Facebook page. Detective Matt Bartel said the page is just another way to reach out to the community to keep them informed on happenings with the department. He says the page can also be utilized to seek information on potential suspects or witnesses in criminal cases.




