Groundbreaking Ceremony Planned for Hodge Center



Groundbreaking for the Jerry and Margaret Hodge Center for Pharmacy and Rural Health is June 17 at 1:30 pm on SWOSU's campus in Weatherford. The public is invited to attend this historical moment for SWOSU and the community.

The Hodge Center project will allow SWOSU to substantially increase Nursing and Allied Health capacity while enhancing the university's pharmacy doctoral

program. The building will also expand community health services by SWOSU's Center for Rural Health.

More strategic partnerships with other higher education institutions could lead to SWOSU students having access to a physician's assistant program and opportunities for dual-degree programs through SWOSU's College of Pharmacy.

The vision of the Hodge Center is made possible through a historic private-public partnership. SWOSU will combine \$10 million in American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 funding authorized by the Oklahoma Legislature with \$5 million in private support received from SWOSU alumnus Jerry Hodge and his wife, Margaret, of Amarillo, Texas.

The Hodges' contribution, announced in 2021,

represents the largest charitable gift in SWOSU history. Both Jerry and Margaret will be present at the groundbreaking ceremony.

An additional \$7 million in support for the Hodge Center will be provided via the "Yes! Weatherford" economic development sales tax extension initiative, approved by Weatherford voters in 2020.



WESTERN OKLAHOMA/SALES TAX- Sales tax figures released for April sales showed a mixed bag of results in Western Oklahoma municipalities. Weatherford, Thomas, and Cordell all showed increases, while Clinton and Elk city experienced declines. The city of Weatherford was up 3.3% at \$1 million, 36 thousand dollars. Thomas had a 25% hike at just over \$49,000. Cordell was up just under 2% at a little more than \$98,000. Clinton had a less than half percent decline at nearly \$522,000 and Elk City was down 4.1% at just under \$1.2 million.

CUSTER CO/FLOODING DAMAGE- Another bout of heavy rain and storms in Custer County did some structure damage to roofs and trees in the Clinton area. Weatherford fire crews were called to Payne Lake Road for a water rescue of a motorist in flood water. Additionally, at least two county roads have been closed due to wash outs.

ODOT/DIST 5 RECOGNITION- Oklahoma department of transportation District 5 in Clinton was recognized with a director's safety award. Divsion 5 engineer Brent Almquist says district wide traffic crew in Clinton was recognized for working injury free in 2021.


