






reached the age of 68 years, 2 months.

HIGHER GROUND

Christmas in a Broken World



As I write this on the eve of Christmas, my cup is not quite filled. The snow storm in the Midwest has prevented my Indiana loved ones from coming. Last year Covid 19 was the enemy, this year a massive storm that has kept many from their annual trek home.

I'm not mad at God; disappointed but not angry. For I know that there is a bigger

plan at work than my little mind can conceive. But there are things that make me mad; not at God but at the evil one who is going about looking for those he can destroy. Jesus spoke of him in John 10:10. "The thief comes to steal, kill, and destroy; I am come that you might have life, and have it to the full." This should be a time of joy unspeakable as we celebrate the greatest birth in history; mighty God of creation taking on flesh to build a bridge to God's grace and forgiveness and providing access to a

relationship with Him. The little baby born in a manger was to "die for our sins, the righteous for

the unrighteous that he might bring us to God." I Peter 3:18. How our world needs to recognize that great truth. life can bring great pain. For almost 20 years I have been involved in the Angel Tree ministry, sponsored by Prison Fellowship. This is an effort, started by Chuck Colson in 1986 to minister to children who have a parent, or sometimes both parents away from home during Christmas serving time in jail or prison. Many times it is not just the inmate who suffers it is the whole family.

Members of churches buy a gift in the name of their absent parent, to demonstrate their love even though they are not present. This year in delivering the gifts I have asked the caregivers to come to me so that I can hear their stories. I have set across the table in Braum's to hear the pain of broken relationships, of embarrassment, shame and guilt.

One young mother of three, living in a small trailer off the beaten path, shared her fears of the impending deportation of her husband in a

situation that seems so unfair. He had come to this country as a baby, grew up, married and made mistakes. I did not ask the nature of his offense. But because of that crime he is facing deportation away from his family,

back to Mexico where he has no family or friends.

It seems so unfair at a time when millions are pouring across the border, that we would send one away, leaving a wife and children who need

his care. It will be a life sentence. Another mother shared her heartbreak of sons who were so captured by meth that they had stolen much of the family property to support their addition. Through tears she shared the pain of raising teenagers in a world gone mad with false promises of pleasure and fulfillment from the thief who came to destroy.

As I prayed with each of the families, I realized how blessed I have been. Raised in a poor but loving family, in Christmas's that brought one present at best, but seeing honesty and integrity displayed in life's circumstances.

These families of incarcerated parents need a support system; the children will grow up with a strong chance of repeating the mistakes of their father or mother unless the cycle is broken. In his sermon in his hometown of Nazareth, Jesus proclaimed that he had come to set the captive

Those who have chosen to follow Him need to be His hands and feet to bring freedom to those held in bondage; to relinquish our rights to comfort and convenience, not asking whose fault

The bare-breasted Liberty Quarter of 1916 caused much speculation about its design.

On the 1916 quarter her right breast was exposed (due to modesty concerns of the public, use your imagination).

Production started late in the year and 52,000 pieces left the Mint on December 29 causing an instant rarity

for collectors which continues today.

Soon after the public protested their release.

People contacted Congress to stop production and demanded the coins be taken out of circulation.

(The result of the protests caused the Mint to cover Liberty's breast with a chain mail). In November 2022 a 1916 Liberty quarter sold for \$10,500

CUSTER CO / COURTHOUSE FILES - Custer County District 1 Commissioner Wade Anders gave an update about the progress in clearing stored files from the third floor of the Custer County Courthouse. The area had previously served as the old jail. Anders said the process of moving stored items continues and reduces the weight, easing structural issues on that floor. Commissioners have also discussed enclosing an outdoor area adjacent to the old jail to utilize for storage.

WPS / COUNSELOR GRANT - The Weatherford School District has been awarded a grant for an additional LPC Counselor, licensed counselor and school counselor. Superintendent Jill Henderson says one area the district will focus on is absenteeism. She says the grant is for the remainder of this school year and next school year.

WESTERN OK / SEVERE WEATHER - A Siberian Winter System swept through Western Oklahoma last Thursday morning and dropped temperatures into the single digits and 30-40 mph wind gusts caused subzero wind chill temperatures. Some power outages were reported after the cold front passed through. The town of Butler was without power on Thursday.

STITT / AVIATION - In an exclusive interview on Wright Wradio last week, Oklahoma Governor Kevin Stitt talked about the role Western Oklahoma plays in his plans for increased emphasis on the aviation and defense industry. Stitt says that Southwestern Oklahoma State University's commitment to aviation studies and the development of the Burns Flat Spaceport will be key to attracting young people to the industry.
