



New Beginnings



"I wish that there were some wonderful place Called the Land of Beginning

Where all our mistakes and all

our heartaches And all of our selfish grief Could be dropped like a shabby

old coat by the door And never be put on again."

The first verse of Louise Fletcher's poem reflects the feelings of many. Each New Year brings the possibilities of a new chapter of life. Unfortunately, the credit card companies do not wipe the slate clean, nor do our responsibilities suddenly change. But we can embark with a new attitude towards all those things. We can continue to make the same mistakes that got us in trouble last year or we can change. The New



2023 Coin Production is in Full Swing!





During the last months of 2022, both the Denver and the Philadelphia Mint began coin production for 2023.

The Lincoln cent, Jefferson nickel, and Roosevelt dime will be minted in quantities sufficient for daily commerce.

To commemorate **Trent Boesen** notable American

women for 2023, Quarters will be dedicated to Maria Tallchief, Bessie Coleman, Jovita Idar, Edith Kanaka'ole, and Eleanor Roosevelt.

Kennedy half dollars dated 2023 will continue its production run at the mints for sale to collectors. The past two years (2021 and 2022) saw Kennedy half dollars, ordered by the Federal Reserve to be released into circulation.

Maria Tallchief will be on the 2023 Native American dollar which will not be put into general circulation. Collectors will be able to purchase them through the U.S. Mint on its website.

With a new year comes new road projects in the city of Weatherford. Economic development director Yolanda Creswell says the much-anticipated Lyle Road project will begin in mid-January. Creswell says the airport road expansion project will begin on January 9th.



WRH / ILLNESS - While some parts of the country continue to be hammered with illnesses such as the flu, COVID-19, and RSV, those illnesses have recently lightened up says Weatherford Regional Hospital's Chief Executive Officer Brian Denton. However, Denton says emergency room visits remain steady.

WEATHERFORD CC / LIFT STATION - The Weatherford City Commission has approved a change order for the Weatherford business and technology north park lift station. Water Superintendent Trent Perkins says the cost of the change order to the city is just over \$46,000.

WEATHERFORD CC / ENGINEERING - The Weatherford City Commission recently approved an agreement between the city and Myers engineering for engineering services on the Lyle and Lawter Road projects as required by the Oklahoma Department of Transportation. The engineering services would be on an as-needed basis during construction.

OK / SCHOOL ENROLLMENT - Oklahoma's annual student enrollment for public schools increased for the second year in a row during the 2022-23 school year. Weatherford public schools enrollment for the current school year is up 3.74% over last school year at 2388 students. Clinton was up less than 1% at 2080 students. Thomas-Fay-Custer was down a total of 9 students at 465 and Arapaho-Butler was down 10 students at 474. Additionally, Elk City was up less than 1% at 2108 students. Cordell was down a total of 30 students at 599. Burns Flat-Dill City dropped 27 students over last school year at 493 students. See Page 7 for comments from State Superintendent Joy Hoffmeister's.



Oklahoma Public School Enrollment Continues 2020 Rebound

schools increased for the second year in a row during the 2022-23 school year. Oklahoma State Department of Education (OSDE) data shows 701,258 public school students enrolled in Pre-K through 12th grade, up from 698,696 in 2021-22 and 694,113 in 2020-21. Enrollment is approaching the 2019-20 count of

703,650.

"Oklahoma families recognize the value of their local public schools, and with good reason," said State Superintendent of Public Instruction Joy Hofmeister. "Our public schools are consistently implementing the Ready Together Oklahoma plan and other strategies to help students succeed in the wake of challenges spurred by the global pandemic. As enrollment steadily increases, it is important that the state Legislature ensure our educators are well-prepared to provide a high-quality education."



Tulsa Public Schools remains the largest district in the state with 33,871 students this school year, followed by Oklahoma City Public Schools with 33,245 students.

Demographic information shows little change in the racial and ethnic makeup of public school students in Oklahoma.

Hispanic, American Indian, Black, Asian, Hawaiian/Pacific Islander and students who are two or more races make up 55 percent of statewide enrollment and 45 percent of students are white.

Hispanic/Latino students make up 20 percent of enrollment, 11 percent of students are Native American or Alaska Native, 8 percent are African American and 2 percent are Asian. Less than 1 percent of students are Hawaiian or Pacific Islander and 13 percent reported being two or more races.




