Western Oklahoma Christian School Now Enrolling for 2026–2027

TAX CREDITS APPLICATIONS OPEN

MARCH 16 - JUNE 15, 2026

Families across Western Oklahoma seeking a faith-based, personal approach to education are finding a strong fit at Western Oklahoma Christian School (WOCS). Known for small class sizes and hands-on learning rather than all-day laptop use, WOCS is now enrolling students for the 2026–27 school year. The school serves students at campuses in Clinton, Weatherford, Elk City, and Hinton.

The Clinton campus, the school's oldest, serves the most grade levels. Weatherford has expanded since moving from a church facility into its own building. Elk City added a three-year-old program in 2023 and has completed facility upgrades. Hinton opened this year. Class offerings vary by campus based on space and community demand, with additional grades added as interest grows.

In addition to its strong academic programs, WOCS offers numerous services to support both students and parents:

Scholarships and Tax Credit: Applications are available once a student has enrolled. More information is contained in this story.

Financial Flexibility: Tuition payment plans to ease financial planning.

Extended Care: Before and after school care programs for added convenience.

Community Engagement: Opportunities for students and families to participate in community service projects.

Transportation: Bus routes are available to the various campuses.

Families considering WOCS are encouraged to plan ahead for the Oklahoma Parental Choice Tax Credit, which can provide awards of up to \$7,500 per child. Students must be enrolled at WOCS before families can apply for the tax credit.

Because processing takes time, families should allow for the WOCS application review, a family interview, and completion of enrollment before submitting a tax credit application.

Tax credit applications are only open March 16 through June 15, a change from previous years.

The application for admission is on the WOCS website at www.wocs.org. To ensure the best fit for each family, the enrollment process includes a family interview. The last step in the enrollment process is enrolling online.

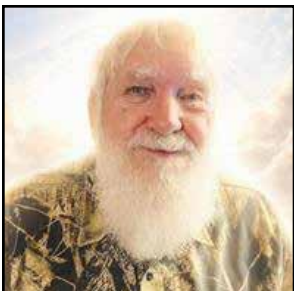
Daniel Smith

Senate Session Review by Senator Darcy Jech

The second session of the 60th Oklahoma Legislature is now in session. As always, I look forward to representing Senate District 26 at the Capitol. This session began on February 2 with Governor Kevin Stitt’s final State of the State address. The governor also presented the Legislature with his executive budget proposal for the upcoming fiscal year.

The state budget outlook presents some challenges. In December, the State Board of Equalization certified revenue projections showing about \$694 million less in available spending than the \$12.6 billion appropriated this year. The governor uses these figures to build his state budget proposal, and the Board will meet again in February to certify updated numbers. Those updated projections will guide the Senate and House Appropriations Committees as we develop a state spending plan for the fiscal year that begins July 1.

I will continue serving as chairman of the Senate Aeronautics and Transportation Committee, while also serving on the Public Safety, Judiciary and Rules committees. I’m also still a member of the Senate Appropriations Committee and the Appropriations Subcommittee on Natural Resources and Regulatory Services. In recent weeks, the Appropriations subcommittees have held a series of public meetings with agency leaders to discuss their annual budget requests. Understandably, most agencies requested budget increases. The subcommittees will work closely with agency heads throughout this session as we work to build a balanced state budget.

Education is poised to be the focus of this legislative session, especially as we explore ways to improve child literacy. I’ve filed several bills related to education, including measures to continue school security funding after the state’s three-year pilot program expires and to expand how public school foundations can use their funds to support professional development, scholarships and new classroom technology.

In recent years, the Legislature has made criminal justice reform a priority while still preserving public safety. To build on that progress, I’ve filed several bills to reform the Oklahoma Pardon and Parole Board.

Other legislation I filed addresses the need to protect children from the growing risks associated with social media. Taxes are also a recurring topic each session, and that won’t change this year. I’ve filed bills to modify gross production taxes and the taxes levied on vehicle sales.

On a final note, I always enjoy hosting high school students from my district who volunteer to serve as Senate pages during the session. The page program gives students a behind-the-scenes look at the legislative process and helps spark an interest in public service. I look forward to meeting this year’s pages.

Award-Winning Author and Historian John J. Dwyer to Give Weatherford Banquet Address

The Brigadier General Douglas Hancock Cooper Camp #2361 of the Oklahoma Division of the Sons of Confederate Veterans will host a Lee/Jackson banquet at 6:30 P.M. on Friday, February 27th at Lucille's Roadhouse in Weatherford. The recently chartered camp, which meets monthly in Clinton, is excited and honored to bring Oklahoma's own John J. Dwyer (<https://www.johnjdwyer.com/>) to Weatherford. Dwyer, a renowned Oklahoma historian, educator, pastor, and award-winning author, will give the keynote address. Mr. Dwyer has published numerous books, including the highly acclaimed two-volume history of Oklahoma entitled The Oklahomans, and heads the Red River Institute of History, an organization devoted to teaching the history of Oklahoma and telling the stories of her people.

The purpose of the banquet is to honor and perpetuate the memory of Confederate generals Robert E. Lee and Stonewall Jackson. The event is open to the public and will be of particular interest to history lovers, especially those with an interest in

these two generals, the War Between the States, and the South in general. Reservations are required by February 19 and may be made with a call to camp commander and event coordinator Silas Dodgen, who may be reached at (580) 774-9718. Attendees will have a chance to purchase autographed copies of Dwyer's books, which include both historical works and novels, and meet the author.

Admission, payable at the door by cash or check, is \$17 for adults, \$5 for kids 6-12, and free for kids 5 and under.

The Sons of Confederate Veterans (SCV) is the direct heir of the United Confederate Veterans and is the oldest hereditary organization for male descendants of Confederate soldiers. Organized at Richmond, Virginia in 1896, the SCV continues to serve as a historical, patriotic, and non-political organization dedicated to ensuring that the history of the 1861-1865 period is preserved and that the service and sacrifice of the Southern soldiers and sailors are not forgotten. Membership in the SCV is open to all male descendants of any veteran who served honorably in the Confederate armed forces.

WEST OK / DEVON MERGER - Following a proposed merger with Coterra Energy, Devon Energy is moving its corporate headquarters to Houston. "I really think that's a poor decision, but it doesn't surprise me with how big Devon Energy has gotten," State Representative Anthony Moore of Clinton reacted to the news. "I think if you go back and look, Phillips did something very similar. I don't think that worked out well in the long run for Phillips, especially Phillips in Oklahoma." Officials with Devon and Coterra said additional details about integration plans will be shared as the transaction moves toward closing. The merger is expected to be finalized next year, setting the stage for further decisions about how operations will be split between Houston and Oklahoma City.

ODOT / WINTER STORM - ODOT's Executive Director spoke to the transportation commission about the work of crews during the recent winter storm. "Since January 19th, ODOT spent about \$7.7 million on our winter weather response. That includes 44,000 tons of salt and sand [and] a little more than half a million gallons of brine," explained Division 5 Engineer Will Snipes.

CLINTON / RUSSELL RETIREMENT - Clinton Fire Chief Brett Russell was honored at the most recent city council meeting with a retirement reception, marking 27 years of service to the city. As he enters retirement, Russell plans to focus on his personal business and enjoy his time being a grandfather.
