The Bessie Community & Fire Department is continuing a beloved local tradition with its annual Pancake Supper on Monday, March 2, 2026 and this year's spotlight is on a true country classic: whole hog sausage.

The supper will be held from 4:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. at the Bessie Gym, located at the corner of Main and 7th Street in Bessie. A drive-thru pickup option will also be available on the west side of the gym. While fluffy pancakes are always a crowd favorite, it's the whole hog sausage that sets this event apart. Unlike commercial sausage blends, whole hog sausage is made the old-fashioned way using the entire hog, seasoned and processed together to create a rich, balanced flavor that reflects traditional farm-style butchering.

By using all cuts of the pork rather than select portions, the result is a fuller, more robust taste and authentic texture that many say you just can't find in grocery stores.

Prepared with time-honored methods, the sausage served at the supper is a nod to Oklahoma's rural heritage and community roots. For many families, it's not just a meal it's a taste of tradition.

Dine-in guests can enjoy all-you-can-eat pancakes and whole hog sausage while eating at the gym. Meal prices are \$15 for adults and \$10 for children under 12. All to-go orders are \$15 and are not refillable. (There are no child-priced to-go orders.)

All proceeds from the event will go directly to the Bessie Fire Department to support equipment, training, and operational needs.

In addition to the meal, sausage will also be available for purchase during the supper. Bulk Options include:

- Smoked Link (2 lbs.) – \$15
- Unsmoked Link (2 lbs.) – \$15
- Bulk Sausage (2 lbs.) – \$15
- Liver Sausage (1 lb.) – \$6 or 4 for \$20
- Ribs – \$20 per package

Organizers encourage the community to come hungry, bring friends, and enjoy an evening of fellowship centered around great food — especially that hard-to-find, farm-style whole hog sausage.

They also meet with peers from across the state to hold a mock legislative session, in which they write, present, debate and vote on their own legislation. They also elect their own leaders for the week.

**MCCALL / STATE INCOME TAX** - Charles McCall, the Former Oklahoma Speaker of the House and Republican candidate for Governor, recently explained in a radio interview with Wright Wradio the key to economic expansion is eliminating state income tax through a phase-out plan. "Tennessee did a great job of phasing their [state income tax] out, and you can see the economic explosion that took place in the state," explained McCall. "The personal income tax in the state of Oklahoma is the biggest impediment to economic development. Our state has performed well recently, economically, but the states that outperform us have one thing in common: no personal income tax. And we can do that without pressure of ad valorem taxes increasing." McCall added that his proposal would be aimed at attracting new business, encouraging growth, and strengthening the state's long-term economy. "We need to get there. [This] will unlock more people wanting to move to Oklahoma, [along with the] Workforce element that everybody talks about. It will bring more investment to Oklahoma."

**GEARY / BRIDGE REPLACEMENT** - Work has officially begun on a bridge replacement project on the U.S. 281 spurs over Interstate 40 by the Cherokee Trading Post in Geary, OK. The project will replace the existing two-lane bridge with a wider five lane bridge, adding dedicated left-turn lanes for ramps as well as reconstructing the roadway leading to the ramps. Weather permitting, the project is anticipated to be completed in late Fall 2026.

**ELK CITY / FRAUD INVESTIGATIONS** - The Elk City Police Department Criminal Investigations Division recently executed a search warrant at a residence in Edmond in connection with an identity theft investigation involving a business in Elk City. During the execution of the search warrant, Robert Babcock and Jonathan Wrye were located and arrested on Beckham County warrants for, among other things, computer crime violations and identity theft. Both men have been transported and booked into the Beckham County Jail.

**WEATHERFORD / AMAZON UPDATE** Weatherford Mayor Mike Brown says the Amazon Delivery Center currently under construction in Weatherford is moving ahead faster than expected. "[They're] not just breaking ground; it looks like they're halfway done!" exclaimed Brown. "They got started right after first of the year. There's a lot of equipment out there. They've already moved a lot of dirt. It's well on its way; they're on the fast track." Brown says the \$20 million facility was originally projected to be completed by Thanksgiving. That timeline has now been moved up, with completion expected as early as September.

**ELK CITY / CARNEGIE LIBRARY** - In honor of the United States 250th anniversary, the Carnegie Corporation of New York is celebrating the lasting impact of libraries by awarding \$10,000 gifts to historic Carnegie libraries still serving their communities today. The funds support local services and programming while honoring the legacy of Andrew Carnegie, who funded the construction of nearly 1,700 public libraries in the United States between 1886 and 1917. In Oklahoma, there are nine historic Carnegie libraries including Elk City.

**SWOSU / 2026 DISTINGUISHED ALUMNI** Southwestern Oklahoma State University has announced its 2026 Distinguished Alumni Hall of Fame honorees. Known as SWOSU's highest honor, the Distinguished Alumni Hall of Fame was established in 1976 by SWOSU to recognize outstanding former students and to celebrate their achievements. The 2026 inductees include: Bennie Beutler, who leads Beutler & Son Rodeo Company; Melvena Heisch, who previously served as Deputy State Historic Preservation Officer; John Lassiter, who has served in many capacities including Oklahoma State Representative from 1986-1990; and Bruce Magill, who is the founder of Magill Insurance & Real Estate in Weatherford. The 2026 Distinguished Alumni honorees will be recognized during the SWOSU Convocation Activities planned for May 8th and 9th on the Weatherford campus.

**CLINTON / BRICK-AND-MORTAR STORES** Clinton Mayor David Berrong says online shopping hasn't changed the city's potential for brick-and-mortar businesses. "You just have to get on the Interstate to see about one out of every three vehicles is an Amazon truck. If there's not that, it's a Walmart truck, and you wonder, have things permanently changed?" expressed Berrong. "I would say a strategic location is always going to be interesting for a brick-and-mortar store. Now, Clinton has been fortunate for most of its life to be geographically interesting. And frankly, the best geographic location in the West." Berrong added that the \$75 million Interstate project will open up opportunities for more brick-and-mortar stores and other businesses in Clinton. "Clinton was established in this location, and it was the right place 100 years ago, and it paid off, and it's still the right place," said Berrong.



## Switzer Family of Quartermaster Creek has Deep Roots

In the red soil and rolling plains just southwest of Leedey, Oklahoma, you will find the Quartermaster Creek Ranch, home to Mike and Annie Switzer. Just like the sagebrush, roots run deep for this couple.

The Switzers pride themselves on raising cattle that will work for most ranches. Once the calves are weighed and weaned, they are turned out on wheat and back on grass until early fall.

120 days before their annual bull and female sale in February, the cattle are shipped to a grow yard in Hereford, TX, and fed a grow ration. Thirty days prior to the sale, the bulls are shipped back to the ranch. There, they receive dry hay and cattle cubes until they are sold as two-year-old bulls ready to work.

Prior to their annual sale, Mike stated that he was always nervous and doubtful, wondering if the buyers would come. When the sale is over, he is always humbled by the number of repeats and new buyers that attend.

Mike said he once heard the quote, "the best fertilizer for any business is the owners' footsteps." This simple quote reminds him daily that, to be successful, he needs to continue to be hands-on and never stop working to improve his operation.

Mike and Annie take pride in their land, cattle, and roots. Because of these roots or where they came from, families with strong work ethics, integrity, honesty, and the love of the land, they feel they owe their success. Annie said her biggest joy is seeing the new babies hit the ground and all the previous year's hard work coming to life. Mike finds joy in seeing the two-year-old heifers calving, knowing that this process started three years back.

As with any operation, the Switzers face the day-to-day struggles all ranches face, weather conditions, income vs. input, etc. However, at the end of the day, the couple feels blessed to be able to live the lifestyle they love.

## Davis Family Has a Storied History of Cattle Production

The Davis family started as cotton farmers before transitioning into raising cattle more than 40 years ago. They have been selling Black Angus bulls for 49 years. Davis Angus consists of Jim and Debbie Davis, their daughter Jordan Cook, her husband Nocona, and their two sons Denton and Baylor.

“The "Davis Difference" people want is to add value to their herd and gain a better profit,” Jim Davis said. “We believe the best way to do this is through value genetics, which we strive to provide to our customers.”

The Davis family wants to help other beef producers have successful operations, and they hope their bulls help others accomplish that goal.

“We don't just sell cattle,” Debbie stressed, “We sell information. It is important we provide information to our customers, so they can make a proper bull selection for their herd,” she added. “We stand behind what we sell and want the customer to have the opportunity to make an informed decision.”

The Davis family weighs their cattle at birth, weaning, and yearling. They also perform DNA tests and ultrasounds.

“Every calf that goes through the shoot at Davis Angus has a DNA blood card,” Debbie explained. They send in their samples for each calf to the American Angus Association, which has an extensive database.

Davis Angus also focuses on feed efficiency, calving ease, and carcass traits.

“The Targeting the Brand is the program that the American Angus Association has for those cattle that are eligible for Certified Angus Beef (CAB),” Debbie said.

This helps producers target high-quality beef. Your bulls have to meet certain requirements, such as marbling and dollar grid values, to become CAB.

The association also provides a program where producers can sell their Angus cattle through the Certified Angus Beef program. If you have an Angus calf, you can sell and produce a better product for more money through this program.



# Oklahoma History: Woody Guthrie's 1945 Hit "This Land Is Your Land"

February 23, 1940, dawned cold and gray in New York City. In a small room at the Hanover House hotel near Times Square, 27-year-old Woody Guthrie sat with a blank page. The Oklahoma-born troubadour Guthrie was tired of hearing Kate Smith sing Irving Berlin's patriotic "God Bless America" over the airwaves. That morning, he picked up his pencil and crafted a song. A song for the downtrodden and displaced, a song that would soon become "This Land Is Your Land."

Guthrie scratched out his new verses under the original ironic title "God Blessed America for Me". Line by line, he sketched a portrait of America from his perspective, full of majestic valleys, endless skies, and ribbon highways. He even added lyrics about "No Trespassing" signs and empty stomachs, underscoring the song's quiet challenge to inequality.

Woody Guthrie carried Oklahoma with him wherever he went. Born in 1912 in Okemah, Oklahoma, he grew up amid oil-boom prosperity and harsh reversals. The Guthries faced one hardship after another, fires, financial ruin, and his mother's grave illness.

By his mid-teens, Woody was on his own, scraping by on odd jobs. At 15, he left home to ride freight trains across the Southwest with a guitar on his back. In boxcars and hobo camps, he strummed old folk tunes and found eager listeners among fellow migrants.

In 1935, The Dust Bowl's devastation uprooted countless families, influencing Guthrie's social conscience.

The Great Depression and Dust Bowl droughts of the 1930s hit Oklahoma hard and Guthrie watched as dust storms turn day into night and he saw proud farmers lose everything. In 1937, he joined thousands of Okies trekking west to California. In Los Angeles, his plainspoken Okie drawl and down-to-earth songs earned him a spot on local radio, where migrant families found comfort in his authentic voice. Between traditional ballads, he sang his own lament for busted farms and hungry mouths, giving voice to those the Dust Bowl had dispossessed.

By the late 1930s, Guthrie had become a champion of the working class. His travels brought him into contact with union organizers and socialist thinkers, deepening his commitment to workers' rights and social justice.

Songs like "Hard Travelin'" and "Do Re Mi" bristled with the real stories of migrants and laborers barely getting by. Guthrie's gift was turning their struggles into plain-spoken songs that captured their feeling.

When Guthrie arrived in New York City in early 1940, the city's folk singer Pete Seeger, and the Almanac Singers among them, hailed him as the real deal. He had lived the hardscrabble life they only sang about. That winter in New York, Guthrie distilled his experiences into "This Land Is Your Land." The lyrics celebrated America's natural beauty from California to the New York Island, but the refrain carried a populist punch, insisting that the nation "was made for you and me" – that the land belonged to everyone, not just the wealthy or fortunate.

Guthrie didn't immediately publish "This Land Is Your Land". It wasn't until 1944 that he recorded it, and by then he had dropped the most radical verses about private property and hunger to avoid ruffling patriotic feathers. Still, the heart of the song stayed true. In the years that followed, this humble folk tune took on a life of its own. Schoolchildren across the country learned to sing it, and 1960s folk revivalists revived its protest spirit. During the civil rights era, "This Land Is Your Land" was sung as an anthem of equality and inclusion, inspiring a new generation of folk singers like Bob Dylan.

In 2009, folk icon Pete Seeger joined Bruce Springsteen in Washington, D.C., leading a crowd in singing "This Land Is Your Land" at President Barack Obama's inauguration. They even included the long-omitted "No Trespassing" verse, letting its meaning ring out at the Lincoln Memorial. At that moment, Woody's words echoed across the National Mall, reaffirming that the American land truly belongs to the people.

More than 85 years after that gray February morning, "This Land Is Your Land" endures as an American classic. It has been recorded by countless artists and heard everywhere from summer camps to picket lines. The Library of Congress added Guthrie's 1944 recording to the National Recording Registry in recognition of its cultural significance. Often called America's "other national anthem," Woody Guthrie's folk song remains both hopeful and challenging. His Oklahoma roots, Dust Bowl struggles, and working-class ethos all live on in the melody and verses, reminding everyone that this land was made for you and me.
