School might be winding down around Western Oklahoma, but the Weatherford High School Athletics program is hard at work preparing for a big weekend as they're set to host their 2nd Annual Athletic Auction on Thursday, May 21 at the Mike Brown Event Center as well as their 19th Annual Golf Tournament on Friday, May 22 at Prairie West Golf Course.

Both events play a critical role in raising funds for anything and everything Weatherford Athletics' teams may need. "We use the funds to buy uniforms, equipment, pay for all the officials that we have to have for our different sporting events, and just like with everything else in the world, those costs keep going up," said Kyle Null, Weatherford High School's Athletic Director.

But despite rising costs affecting nearly everything and everyone across the world, Null is committed to keeping admission prices for Weatherford Athletics at the same price they've been for over 20 years. "I am gonna try to keep ticket prices at \$5, but in

order to do that we have to raise money to be able to stay afloat and keep providing our athletes and coaches with the things that they need," said Null.

To accomplish that mission of keeping admission prices low while supporting all of Weatherford High School's athletic needs, Null, in coordination with the various Weatherford athletics booster clubs, have curated a treasure trove of auction items that will be available for bids at the Weatherford Athletic Auction. Some of the items that will be on the auction block include: Four courtside tickets to an OKC Thunder game next year; memorabilia and merchandise from the OKC Thunder as well as various Weatherford athletes in the college and professional leagues; an assortment of weekend getaways; a one night hog hunt with former OSU Cowboy Aden Kelley; and an assortment of concert tickets to scheduled events at the Paycom center.

The following morning beginning at 8:30am, Weatherford Athletics will also host their 19th annual Golf Tournament.

Although the teams for the tournament have been filled there are still hole sponsorships available for interested businesses and individuals. Each hole sponsor will be able to have their logo placed on a teebox for the price of \$200.

Doors open for the Athletic Auction at 6pm on Thursday, May 21 at the Mike Brown Event Center. From 6pm to 7pm guests will be invited to enjoy a social hour as well as peruse and place bids for items in the silent auction. Dinner, which will be catered by Lucille's Roadhouse, will be served at 7pm and a live auction will begin at 7:45pm at which point silent auction bids will be closed.

Tickets and tables for the Athletic Auction dinner are still available, but space is limited. Individual tickets cost \$25 while a reserved table for 6 costs \$200.

CBA's Bentli Whitson Makes History with a Top 10 State Finish, Earns All-State Honors

Corn Bible Academy senior Bentli Whitson has etched her name into school history with a standout performance at the OSSAA Class 2A Girls State Golf Tournament, held at Muskogee Golf Club.

Whitson qualified for the state tournament after finishing in the top three individually at the regional qualifier at Falconhead Resort & Golf Club near Burneyville. In doing so, she became the first female golfer in Corn Bible Academy history to advance to state competition.

Competing against the top players in Oklahoma, Whitson opened the two-day tournament with a strong round of 83 in challenging, windy conditions. Her steady play and ability to avoid trouble placed her in 6th overall after day one.

Day two presented both adversity and resilience. Paired with Jolie Pinkard of Balco-Forgan and top-ranked freshman Lilly Reid of Regent Prep, Whitson started solid with back-to-back pars. She finished the front nine with a 41, staying competitive among the field.

The back nine tested her composure. After a difficult stretch that included a triple bogey and a (9) maximum score on the next hole, Whitson faced a defining moment. Refusing to let the round slip away, Coach Bates and Bentli marched to the next tee and said a little prayer, she regrouped and responded with two pars and a birdie over the next

three holes. She closed strong, posting a back nine 44 for a final round of 85.

Her two-day total secured a Top 10 finish, placing 7th overall in Class 2A.

Following the conclusion of play, Whitson's day was not yet over. She found herself tied for the final All-State position among seniors on the west side, forcing a sudden-death playoff against Birdie Brown of Cordell.

After nearly three hours of waiting, both players returned to the course for the playoff. Battling through two tied holes on the par-4 18th, the playoff moved to the par-5 9th hole. Both golfers executed strong drives and approach shots, setting up a dramatic finish. Brown missed her par attempt, leaving Whitson with a four-foot putt to secure All-State honors. She calmly converted the putt, sealing the victory.

With the win, Whitson not only earned All-State recognition but also became the first golfer in Corn Bible Academy history to achieve the honor.

The tournament also crowned the Cordell Lady Blue Devils as the Class 2A State Champions. (Birdie Brown, MacKinlee Brunker, Mylee Brunker, Rylee Kelly & Killie Rasmussen)

Whitson's performance marks a milestone for Corn Bible Academy athletics and caps an impressive high school golf career defined by determination, composure, and historic achievement.

ELK CITY / WATER REPAIR - Elk City Commissioners recently approved a resolution for an emergency repair of a 20-inch water main line that recently broke. “We had to declare an emergency to do a no-bid contract to get it repaired. We got the final bill and resolution on that.” City Manager Tom Ivester said of the repairs. “It came in at \$178,000, and we were able to get that repaired within about 72 hours of the break. [We’re] pretty excited about the response time and getting that done and going through the whole emergency declaration process and no-bid process.” The damaged water line was located at 7th Street and Pioneer Street.

CLINTON / NEW FIRE CHIEF - Mark Switzer has been officially appointed as Chief of the Clinton Fire Department. Switzer was named Interim Chief at the end of January and will now take on the role permanently. I was [recently] extended the opportunity for the fire chief position, and I'm grateful for the opportunity,” expressed Switzer. “I'm excited to be able to serve the citizens of Clinton and the surrounding communities. I don't take it lightly, but I am very excited.” Switzer also spoke about his experience with the department: “I've been a Clinton fireman for coming up on 13 years now. I have a passion to serve others in our community, and I look forward to being able to utilize this new position to further move forward with that.” Additionally, D.J. Woodall has been named Deputy Fire Chief for the department.

WEATHERFORD / COMMUNITY CENTER Weatherford Mayor Mike Brown recently spoke about the community center project, saying officials are still awaiting cost estimates on the project. “When we first started talking about it, we were talking about a \$30 million project,” Brown explained. “Then we heard about a \$40 million [estimate]. We're comfortable in the \$40 million project; we're not comfortable in a \$50 million project or even a \$45 million.” Brown also discussed potential adjustments that may be made to the project if the cost is higher than expected, focusing on scaling down elements such as the square footage. “We're looking at 60 to 70,000 square foot, so it's quite a bit bigger than what the existing facility is. So do we scale it back? It's still new, it still has all the things we want, but maybe it's still the same size as what they've been. So, you know, we want to expand the child care [and] the swimming program...but we'll start looking at what is [most] significant.” The community center will be owned by the city of Weatherford and operated by the YMCA. Brown anticipates the center to be completed by June of 2028.

CLINTON / ROUTE 66 GRANT - The city of Clinton has been awarded more than \$650,000 of grant funding from the Oklahoma Department of Commerce for the Route 66 Revitalization Project. “The money for the firehouse project seems to be in place, and we'll be doing some discussion,” Clinton City Manager Robert Johnston explained to the city council about the grant. “We may not know until [June or July] that we get a grant contract for y'all to vote [on]--like I said, I think it's virtually in hand, [but] we can't absolutely bank on it--so we'll be doing some preliminary discussion and kind of fleshing out what we're really going to do now that the money has been approved.” The project is planned to convert the former Clinton Fire Station on Gary Boulevard into a welcome center.

Johnson Steps Down as XC/Track Head Coach

Southwestern Oklahoma State University Athletic Director Todd Helton has announced the resignation of head cross country and track & field coach Jennifer Johnson.

"I would like to thank Coach Johnson for her leadership and dedication to our cross country and track & field programs," Helton said. "She has made a lasting impact on our student-athletes and our department, and we wish her nothing but the best moving forward."

Johnson became the interim head coach for both programs in 2019 before being named full-time head coach following that season. In cross country, her Bulldog squad competed at the NCAA Central Region Championships in 2026 for the first time in a decade. In track & field, Johnson coached 19 All-GAC selections and recruited student-athletes who now hold program records in 13 of 21 events.

Johnson also played a key role in the development of the newly renovated locker room for the cross country and track & field programs inside Rankin Williams Fieldhouse.

Her track & field teams have also won all three SWOSU Athletic Bark Battles since the award's inception in 2024. Created by the SWOSU Student-Athlete Advisory Committee, the award is presented annually at the department's end-of-year banquet to the team that demonstrates the greatest engagement and support across SWOSU Athletics.

A former Bulldog herself, Johnson competed for SWOSU cross country from 2010-12. She earned Second Team All-Great American Conference honors during the league's inaugural season in 2011 and still ranks among the program's all-time top 10 with her career-best time.

"It wasn't an easy decision, but I feel this is the right time for me to step away from coaching," Johnson said. "I'm thankful for my time at SWOSU and for the relationships I've built with our student-athletes, coaches, and staff. This program has meant so much to me, and I'm proud of the growth we've seen over the years. I'll always be rooting for their continued success."
