Don't forget to vote in the Custer County Commissioner, District 2 runoff election on August 25. The runoff is between candidate Carl Bailey and candidate Bruce Walker. During the primary election neither candidate was able to receive more than 50 percent of the votes. So, we strongly urge those eligible to vote to do so. For the runoff, registered Republicans residing in District 2 are the only ones eligible to vote. Oklahoma is a closed primary state, which means that registered voters of a political party are only able to vote for their party's nominations.

Voting precincts for the election are Pine Acres Mennonite Church, Weatherford; Life Fellowship Church, Weatherford; CrossPointe Church (formerly, Zion Church), Weatherford; St. Eugene's Catholic Church, Weatherford; and Thomas' Senior Citizens Center, Thomas.

The gold rush of 1849 literality flooded the country with huge tons of gold. All this gold helped to create the birth of a new \$1 gold dollar struck 1849-1889. They were made in uncirculated and proof condition.

(a mirror-like surface). They are a creation of numismatic beauty. Their size is 10 mm (dime size is 17.90 mm).

The proof mintage total for the 1855 \$1 gold coin was 10 examples. Approximately 7 coins exist today. Someone in 1855 bought this gold dollar at the Philadelphia mint in proof condition and took excellent care of it. Its present day conservation is fantastic!

The 1855 gold \$1 coin was certified by the Professional Coin Grading Service as Proof 65+ DCAM. It sold at auction for \$329,000.

- They aren't motivated
- They are lazy

I am going to help you in the first two areas. The last area is up to you. Do you really want to stay where you are, or would you like to "present yourself to God as a workman who is not ashamed?" AS you are prepared, God will open doors to use you and set you free to serve him. Would you join in this venture that will make the Bible come alive? What is even more important, you will become more like the Master in the process. Let me give you a few suggestions that might be helpful, especially in the letters or teaching portions of the New Testament.

Using the acronym TAPES as an example of how to meditate on a short passage...10-12 verses. Ask the following questions of the passage. Are there:

- What are the Teachings of truths in the passages
- How do I need to apply the truth to my life?
- Is there a principle, promise, or something I need to pray about?

• Is there an example I should follow?

• Is there a sin to avoid or a special verse to memorize.

Following a Friday evening meeting of the Great American Conference's Council of Presidents, the league will suspend all fall and winter sports – basketball, cross country, football, soccer and volleyball – and the two-semester sports of golf and tennis through December 31.

The Council made its recommendation in response to last week's directive from the NCAA Board of

## SWODA Awarded \$1.5 million Grant for Opioid Prevention, Treatment, & Recovery

Burns Flat, OK (September 1, 2020) – South Western Oklahoma Development Authority (SWODA) was awarded a \$1,000,000 RCORP (Rural Communities Opioid Response Program)- Implementation grant. This project is supported by the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) as part of an award totaling \$1,000,000 with zero percentage financed with non-governmental sources. The contents are those of the author(s) and do not necessarily represent the official views of, nor an endorsement, by HRSA, HHS or the U.S. Government. The overall goal of the program is to reduce the morbidity and mortality associated with opioid overdoses in high-risk, rural communities by strengthening the capacity of multi-sector community agencies to increase the access of care and resources for prevention, treatment, and recovery. The Western Oklahoma Opioid Prevention Consortium was developed by SWODA Executive Director, Debora Glasgow, and the SWODA Board of Trustees. Twenty-

SWODA wants to reduce the occurrence of Opioid Use Disorder (OUD) among new and at-risk users, as well as, fatal opioid overdoses using Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) on a mobile medical unit while utilizing telehealth services for treatment and recovery in collaboration with Red Rock Behavioral Health Services and Northwest Center for Behavioral Health. The mobile unit will be staffed with an advanced practice registered nurse and patient navigator. Funds will also be used in public schools in conjunction with Oklahoma Department of Health Educators in a life skill training for 3rd-5th graders to help them avoid the misuse/abuse of opioids and prescription drugs. Narcan will be purchased and distributed to Vance and Altus Air Force Base barracks. There will be funds available to train doctors to become Data 2000 waivered to treat opioid abuse disorder patients using MAT. Oklahoma Conference of Churches will train peer coaches and increase the

They will also collaborate with The Amethyst House in Altus to establish a MAT recovery house in central western Oklahoma.

SWODA also received a \$50,000 grant from Telligen Community Initiative (TCI), a private, Iowa-based charitable foundation. The one-year funds will supplement the salaries of the advanced practice registered nurse and a patient navigator for the mobile medical unit. Western Oklahoma Opioid Prevention Consortium was one of only 15 grants selected for TCI's 2020 Oklahoma and Colorado-based funding cycle, which awarded a total of \$640,685 in grants to nonprofit organizations in these states (\$325,000 to Oklahoma and \$315,685 to Colorado). TCI works to support projects in the priority funding areas of health innovation, health care workforce development and access to care for the underserved. Since 2014, TCI has awarded more than \$10.3 million to 251 organizations and projects in Iowa, Illinois, Oklahoma and Colorado.

The Bill and Elois Muncy Memorial Scholarship Fund was established in 2015 by their children—Mike Muncy (SWOSU Class of 1977) of Oklahoma City and Jayne Muncy Hackworth of Centennial (CO). The fund benefits SWOSU students from the Geary, Watonga, Calumet and Greenfield areas.

Bill and Elois Muncy were educated in Hinton. Bill

was one year ahead of Elois in school, and together the two took every math class offered them. Bill wanted to go to college but could not afford it, so after graduation he went to work at his uncle's farm at Geary. They understood the value of education and were always reading and learning. They always said, "Once you learn it, it's yours for life."

The Muncys were proud to sponsor National Honor Society students at Geary High School, believing sincerely that induction into the National Honor Society was as important as making the football team. For many years, the Muncys delighted in regularly treating the honor society students to a steak dinner and a night of bowling in Weatherford. The Muncys were quiet benefactors of several students from the Geary area who could not have otherwise afforded college expenses.

The Bill and Elois Muncy Memorial Scholarship is stewarded by the SWOSU Foundation, Inc., which was established in 1977 to promote philanthropy, award scholarships, and distribute funds to support the activities and programs of SWOSU. Located on the Weatherford campus in the historic Burton House, the Foundation currently stewards over \$26 million in assets for the benefit of SWOSU.
