



In the coin collecting world fresh discoveries always excite people. The above pictured coin, a 1794 silver dollar, is a prime example.

This dollar was discovered in the southern region of the United Kingdom about 25 years ago along with

an accumulation of coins.

It is certified by the Numismatic Guaranty Corporation as About Uncirculated 55. It will head to auction on August 19, 2021 in California.

This 1794 silver dollar has a low mintage of just 1,758 examples with an estimated surviving population of 130 to 150 known pieces.

In 2013 the finest example of a 1794 silver dollar sold for \$10 million dollars.
